

Linkage

Registered courses have to be linked with your study program and study stage. In order to do so please follow the steps below. There is also available a [short film](#) about linkage on YouTube (in polish only).

1. Log in to your account on <https://www.usosweb.uj.edu.pl>
2. Go to "Student's section" and click "Linkage"
