Student dress code to be observed in class

Students of the Faculty of Medicine, just like practicing doctors, dentists and dietitians, should pay due attention to their appearance, including attire. Dressing appropriately is an expression of respect for other students and academic teachers. It is also important for building rapport based on respect and trust between students and patients. Students should be aware that certain dress styles and body adornments, e.g. earrings or tattoos, may not be accepted by many people. Appropriate clothing during clinical exercises is also one of the factors playing a role in epidemiological prevention.

General rules

- Students should wear official university name tags with their name and surname.
- It is necessary to maintain basic rules of personal hygiene.
- Avoid irritating perfumes and toilet waters.
- If make up is worn, it should be minimal.

Clothes, footwear

- Clothing should be clean and neat.
- Short trousers, miniskirts, sandals and high-heeled shoes are advised against.

Hairstyle

- Hair should be neatly styled and should not cover the face or eyes.
- The length of the hair should not interfere with the examination of the patient.
- Mustache and beard should be neatly trimmed.

Adornments

- Jewellery should be kept to a minimum.
- Tattoos should not be visible.
- Nails should be neatly trimmed.

Institutions conducting classes may require students to wear specific protective clothing.
